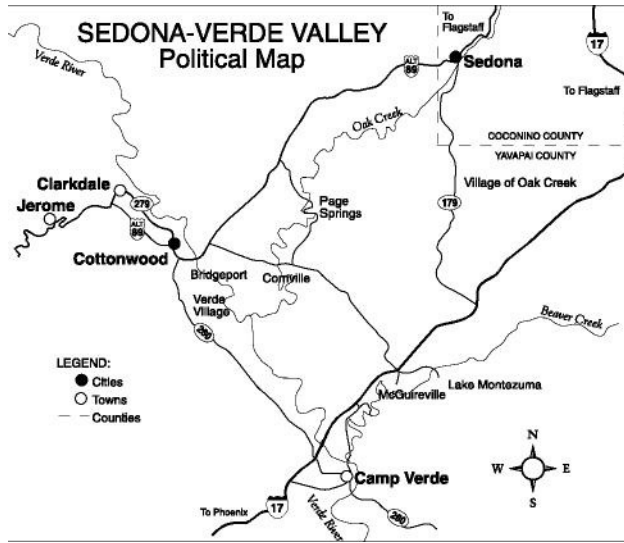

# VOTING INFORMATION

## WHO can register to vote?

A citizen of the United States who is also:

- A resident of Arizona.
- 18 years of age or more on or before the day of the next General Election.
- A convicted felon whose civil rights have been restored.

### Registration Requirements

If this is your first time registering to vote in Arizona or you have moved from another county in Arizona, your voter registration form must also include proof of citizenship.

Acceptable documents are:

- Arizona Driver's License number or non-operating identification license number issued after 10/1/96 (number only).
- Photocopy of a driver's license or non-operating identification license issued by another state that identifies US Citizenship.
- Photocopy of birth certificate that verifies US Citizenship.
- Photocopy of US Passport containing name and passport number.
- Photocopy of US naturalization documents or the number of the certification of naturalization. (If only the number is provided, it will need to be verified.)
- Bureau of Indian Affairs Card Number, Tribal Treaty Card Number or Tribal Enrollment Number (Number only).

DO NOT SEND ORIGINALS; ONLY SEND LEGIBLE PHOTOCOPIES, as outlined above. For complete information, CONTACT YOUR COUNTY RECORDER!

## WHEN can you register?

Anytime! If registering by mail, a voter registration is valid if the postmark indicates it was mailed at least 29 days before the election and it is received by the Recorder's Office by election day.

## WHERE can you register?

Registration forms are available from City or Town Clerk's offices, Dept. of Motor Vehicle offices, libraries, and Post Offices. They can be mailed or completed in person at Offices of County Recorders. Contact the County Recorder's Office Voter Registration Department for registration information, change of party preference, early or absentee voting information. Contact the County Elections Department for election-related procedures, polling locations, candidate or precinct boundary information, and assistance for citizens with disabilities.

### You must RE-REGISTER when you...

- Change your name.
- Change your residential address.
- Change your political affiliation.

You will receive a voter registration card which shows your name and precinct location as it appears on the register within 30 days after the County Recorder receives your registration form.

# ELECTIONS

## Consolidated Election Dates

In Arizona, four Consolidated Election Dates are established for each year, according to State law. While there are exceptions, cities and towns usually hold elections in March (second Tuesday) and May (Third Tuesday). School and fire districts usually hold elections in November (first Tuesday). Every election, including those to decide ballot issues, must be held on an established Consolidated Election Date.

## Primary Election

The Arizona Primary Election is held eight weeks before the November elections date to nominate party candidates for the General Election slate and to elect political party personnel. At the primary, the voter receives the ballot of the political party designated at the time of registration. However, under Arizona's open primary rules, those registered as nonpartisan or independent may select a ballot from any political party that qualifies to have a ballot.

## General Election

The General Election is held the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of even-numbered years to elect national, state, county and local officials and decide ballot issues.

### How to Lobby Elected Officials

Good government does not just happen. If you have informed opinions or special knowledge, your elected officials welcome your letters. To be most effective, keep in mind the following:

1. Letters look more professional than postcards. An original letter carries more weight than a form letter. Say it in your own words.
2. Keep it brief and limit your letter to one subject.
3. Give reasons for your opinion; try to be objective.
4. Write legibly, with both name and address on the page.
5. Express your approval as well as your disapproval.  
Criticism should be constructive.
6. If possible, identify a bill by number or title.
7. Telegrams, phone calls or e-mail have equal weight as letters.

## WHAT IS THE LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS?
